AFA UNION DUES

Under an AFA contract, all Delta flight attendants would be required to pay dues, or a mandatory monthly payment to the union.

So, what are dues?





THREE THINGS TO KNOW ABOUT AFA DUES

Dues are the monthly fee an AFA-represented flight attendant pays to the union. Dues pay for union expenses, including the salaries of union officers and staff and the costs of representing members.



CURRENTLY, AFA-REPRESENTED FLIGHT ATTENDANTS PAY \$50 IN DUES EVERY MONTH — THAT'S \$600 PER YEAR.



IF YOU DON'T PAY DUES, AFA CAN REQUIRE THE COMPANY TERMINATE YOUR EMPLOYMENT.

Something called a "union security clause" is in all union contracts and requires members to pay.



DUES CAN INCREASE AND THERE IS NO MAXIMUM AMOUNT.

The amount you pay in dues is not based on your income. Whether you are just starting your career as a flight attendant or are at the top of the pay scale, you would pay the same amount.
