

LOOK AT IAM'S TRACK RECORD

IAM is back trying to collect A-Cards at Delta despite being repeatedly rejected by employees.

UNSOLICITED TEXTS AND VISITS



- During past campaigns at Delta, IAM repeatedly contacted employees and family members — even minor children and parents — using unsolicited texts and home visits, sometimes repeatedly.
- No matter what you hear, Delta does not share your personal information with IAM.

FALSE AND MISLEADING PROMISES



- IAM has told employees that signing an A-card is just a way of learning about the union. It is not. It is a request for an election.
- Union organizers have told employees who never signed an A-card they needed to renew an expired one.
- IAM promises outcomes and results that it can't guarantee.

FRAUDULENT A-CARDS



- In 2015, IAM filed for an election at Delta and ultimately withdrew its election application after the National Mediation Board found fraudulent A-Cards.

CULTURE OF CORRUPTION



- Between 2013 — 2022, 20 IAM officials from lodges around the country were convicted of embezzling approximately \$1.7 million in member dues, landing them in prison or on probation.*
